PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Remembering an Icon and Looking to the Future

January marked the start of a new year, and it also marked a moment of great loss for the legal community. On January 7, 2016, former **Chief Judge Judith S. Kaye** passed away at her home in Manhattan. Judge Kaye was a pioneer among women. She was the first woman to serve on the New York Court of Appeals, the first woman Chief Judge of the State of New York, and an icon to women lawyers across the country.

As a law student, I learned about Judge Kaye through her many accomplishments. She stood as a symbol to all female lawyers and law students – if a girl from Upstate New York could make it to the highest legal position in the state, any of us who worked really hard could follow in her footsteps. By her example, we strived to achieve, and we have.

When I finally had the pleasure of meeting Judge Kaye in person, and working with her on the Membership Reception that she sponsored at her post-judicial law firm, Skadden Arps Meagher & Flom, LLP, I had the honor of getting a glimpse into the amazing, personable woman that she was. Everyone with whom I have spoken about Judge Kaye has said the same thing – she always made a point to remember me, easily recalling details about my life, and I know that she truly cared.

NOTICE TO MEMBERS – ANNUAL MEETING & ELECTIONS

The NYWBA Annual Membership Meeting will be held on **April 20, 2016**, when the President & Treasurer will present reports on the State of the Association and its finances, and the Association will hold elections for Officer, Director, and Delegate positions. An Evening of Powerful Women: Intersectionality in the Legal Profession

On Tuesday, November 17th, the Cardozo Leadership Association of Women and the Students and New Lawyers Committee of the New York Women's Bar Association co-sponsored an event entitled "Multiple Identities: Intersectionality and the Legal Field." The event included a Panel of female attorneys discussing intersectionality, the theory that overlapping identities—gender, race, sexuality, religion—require a different analysis of an issue than would be required if analyzing an issue from only one of those perspectives.

The Panel consisted of **Tatum Ji**, a Labor and Employment Associate at Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom LLP, **Rachel Sims**, a Corporate Litigation Associate at Blank Rome LLP, and **Ashley C. Akins**, an Assistant District Attorney in the Bronx.

The evening began with a broad overview of women's experiences in the legal field before each panelist presented their experience as a member of another underrepresented group. Topics ranged from discrimination in the workplace and maternity leave, to choosing what type of law to practice and how to find a mentor. The panelists shared several experiences and anecdotes about their time in law school, their careers, and their current positions. For example, Rachel Sims explained how some men assume a woman in the courtroom will be an ineffectual adversary, which led to a lively discussion.

Throughout the evening, the audience posed questions about the importance of finding a mentor, how to balance the roles of being a parent, spouse, and attorney, and what the women wished they had known as they began their studies and careers in law. The panelists stressed the value of networking and self-advocating. Tatum Ji expressed optimism that, although the field seems slow to accept new conceptions of what it means to be a lawyer, it's up to up-and-coming lawyers to move the ball forward.

Among the tougher topics discussed included the best time to start a family and how to educate or reform the workplace to eliminate gender discrimination. Regrettably, all of the panelists said they had faced some type of discrimination in a professional setting. The panelists were also in agreement that there is no perfect time in which to start a family as it relates to charting a career path, but agreed that the timing in juggling these different roles is completely a personal decision.

Following the question and answer portion of the evening, attendees had an opportunity to mingle among the panelists and get personalized ideas about internships, jobs, and strategies to advance in the field.

It was a fantastic evening that left the audience empowered and enlightened. The opportunity to hear about different women's experiences in the profession helped the law students and young women lawyers in attendance better understand how to shape a future in which we can simultaneously be powerful women and outstanding attorneys.

Overview of the Considerations Involved in the EB-5 Path to a Green Card *By Lauren A. Tetenbaum*

Congress created the EB-5 Immigrant Investor Program in 1990 to stimulate the U.S. economy through job creation and capital investment by foreign investors, who become eligible for green cards based on their qualifying investment in a project. The project must create at least either 10 direct jobs or 10 indirect jobs if through a USCIS-designated Regional Center. The minimum qualifying investment amount is \$1 million, or \$500,000 if the project is in a defined Targeted Employment Area ("TEA"), a high unemployment or rural area. Each fiscal year, the Program offers 10,000 eligible foreign nationals an opportunity to become lawful permanent residents.

There are several factors to consider when contemplating an EB-5:

- **Investment:** EB-5 clients may never see a return on their investments. Moreover, several proposed legislative bills suggest raising the qualifying investment amount to at least \$1,200,000 for non-TEA projects or \$800,000 for TEA projects.
- **Employment:** Foreign nationals pursuing an EB-5 have control over their employment in the United States. They are not tied to a sponsoring employer for a period of time like EB-2 or EB-3 beneficiaries, nor must they be sponsored by a U.S. employer (rather, they can petition on their own behalf).
- **Immigrant Visa Availability:** The specific quota allotted for Chinese national EB-5 investors was exceeded in the past two years due to the program's increasing popularity, causing immigrant visa retrogression (backlog). Notably, retrogression also typically affects the EB-2 and EB-3 immigrant visa categories for nationals born in mainland China and other specific countries.

Adjudication of Form I-526 (the first part of the EB-5 petition) currently takes 13-14 months; upon approval, foreign nationals in the U.S. may adjust status or apply for immigrant visas abroad, which can take several months or even years if affected by retrogression. Conditional permanent residency is then granted for two years, at which point Form I-829 is filed to remove conditions, with evidence regarding the capital and job creation requirements.

Attorneys should help clients review their long and short-term travel and living plans, their children's risk of aging out of derivative status, the strength of the project in which they are investing, and more to decide if EB-5 is the right path to a green card for them.
